

Recycling Guidelines



Acceptable Items

PLASTICS - examples:

- Butter tubs
- Milk jugs
- Vitamin pill bottles
- Landscaping pots
- Soda bottles
- Peanut butter jars
- Laundry detergent bottles
- Soap bottles



CARDBOARD - examples:

- Corrugated boxes (wavy middle layer)
- Tissue boxes
- Toilet paper rolls
- Paper towel rolls
- Dry food boxes (cereal/pasta/etc.)
- Gift boxes
- Frozen food/microwaveable food boxes



PAPER - examples:

- Notebook paper
- Newspaper/inserts
- Magazines/catalogs
- Envelopes/folders
- Office/prINTER paper
- Wrapping/craft paper (NOT metallic)
- Paper egg cartons
- Construction paper



METAL - examples:

- **CLEAN** aluminum cans (soda cans, pet food cans, meat cans)
- **CLEAN** steel food/beverage containers without lids (YETI cups, reusable canisters)



Prohibited Items

Prohibited materials include:

- o Garbage/ compost/ trash
- o **Glass of any kind**
- o Take-out or fast-food containers / sandwich wrappers
- o **Styrofoam**
- o Plastic bags or film, toys
- o Clothing hangers, pots, pans, or bowls, aluminum foil, foil trays, pie plates, spray cans, etc.
- o Carpet/ furniture/ electronics



- o Wax or plastic lined cardboard
- o **Mold or heavily food contaminated materials**
- o Paper towels, tissue paper, paper cartons with wax
- o Insulation
- o Hazardous materials (paint, lacquers, chemicals, etc.)
- o Oil (gasoline, motor oil, cooking oils, etc.)
- o **Needles**




Paper towels, toilet paper, facial tissues, and other soft papers

Clothes hangers, aerosol cans, electronics, toys, and other household items



Absolutely NO sharp objects (needles, glass, etc.) or biohazardous waste



Styrofoam, food wrappers, take out containers, etc.



Aluminum foil, foil tins, pie trays, etc.



Paint, gasoline, oils, pesticides, and other hazardous waste



Grocery bags, garbage bags, zipper bags, and other soft plastics
